Concerning attendance

Concerning submissions

The submissions were good and the Standing Committee members was pleased with the standard of submissions received;

Not enough opportunity was given to members of the Standing Committee to unpack some of the submissions that were made.

Agenda

The agenda was fine and the process well managed.

General
