FUNDING, POLICY AND LIAISON

MEASURABLE OBJECTIVE: Promote the participation of South Africans in local and international sport and recreational activities through the funding of associated organisations, and monitor the impact of the programmes on communities



FUNDING, POLICY AND LIAISON

- 1. R69 677 000 was paid over to national federations, macro-bodies and other service providers
- 2. 74085 sportspersons were developed or assisted to participate in events
 - Black 59369
 - White 15608
 - Disabled 419



Sub-directorate: high performance sport and events

- 287 elite athletes assisted in the National Academy programmes against a target of 200.
 - 55 athletes with a disability
 - Included preparation for the Olympic Games, Paralympic Games, Commonwealth Youth Games, Netball and women's cricket
- Met target of 40 medals won at the Olympic and Paralympic Games in Athens

Sub-programme: policy, research and information

- HSRC research on participation patterns in sport and recreation activities
 - Only 25 of South Africans participate in some form of sport and recreation activities
 - 21 are Black South Africans
 - 11% women
- 2. Facility audit in Hubs
 - Great need for indoor facilities
- Collection and archiving of liberation sport materials
 - Put project out on tender

Sub-programme: mass participation

- SIYADLALA MASS PARTICIPATION PROGRAMME
- 92637 people participated in the programme (target was 27000)
 - 325 Youths trained as activity coordinators
 - 40% of participants women
 - 79% of participants youth
 - 4% of participants disabled
- 3. Baseline study conducted on social indicators


