



Projected Expenditure = R208 266

Shortfall = R 40 431

In the 2004/05 financial there was a shortfall of R15 120m and the Department had to augment from the equitable share thus cutting on other planned essential services.

Schools falling under quintile 1 and 2 should according to the norm be fed but due to prevailing circumstances in communities even quintile 3 schools are being covered by this programme.

Feeding is done for 156 days per financial year. No feeding is done during July and December each year. Situations arise where you find that two children from the same family are attending school in the same locality. One is in the primary school and the other in the secondary school. The two children went to school hungry but the one in the primary school is being fed whereas the one in the secondary school still go back home hungry.

HIV/AIDS The under spending is as a result of HIV/AIDS related activities that take place only during school holidays to avoid disruption on learning and teaching at schools.


