Introduction

Umalusi's mandate lies in the objects of the Act:

- to establish a quality assurance body to ensure that continuous enhancement of quality is achieved in the delivery and outcomes of the general and further education and training sectors of the national education and training system;
- develop a quality assurance framework for the general and further education bands of the NQF; and
- regulate the relationship between the national DOE, SAQA and other ETQA bodies, providers and the Council



Vision & Mission

- Umalusi council and staff commit to ensure, through their leadership, the continuous improvement of quality and standards in general and further education and training and a mission that obligates them, as experts in the sector, to promote and secure quality and standards by
 - confirming that assessment is fair, valid and reliable,
 - accrediting educational and assessment providers and
 - monitoring the adequacy and suitability of curriculum and qualifications
 - in order to issue learners with certificates that are credible.



Goals

- promote quality and appropriate standards
- assure the quality and standards through quality assurance of assessment, monitoring of qualifications and standards and the evaluation and accreditation of providers;
- continuously develop in-depth knowledge and expertise;
- issue appropriate and credible certificates of learner achievement in terms of specific standards or qualifications registered on the NQF;
- provide reliable and credible leadership and guidance in the adoption of quality management systems by institutions and in the assurance of standards;
- ensure financial efficiency and sustainability of the organisation; and
- determine expectations and appropriately respond to these within the parameters of Umalusi's mandate.

- Maintaining and improving finance and accounting systems
- Maintaining and improving building and security systems
- Managing and developing human resources







2006/7 Budget Approval




- Minister Pandor approved the budget in her letter dated 22/12/ 2005 for R 26,8 m of the requested R 29,5 m
- The R 2,69 m difference for the quality assurance of grade 9 was subsequently clarified and requested a second time (approval awaited)











Request for additional funds to DoE

- R 21,15 m requested for;
 - Advocacy R 6,000,000
 - Site Inspections R 1,000,000
 - System for Site inspections of existing providers R 3,000,000
 - Site inspections of additional providers R8,000,000



Request for additional funds to DoE

- Continued;
 - Conduct research into the standard of fundamental courses R 650,000
 - quality assurance of the National Senior Certificate R 1,500,000
 - moderation of internal assessment in VET
 R 500,000
 - Credible grade 9 assessment practices R 500,000



Alternatively

If there are not enough funds available to fund the total amount now, we propose considering a minimum amount of R 9,850,000

- Evaluation and Accreditation –R 6,700,000.
- Research and Development –R 650,000.
- Quality Assurance of Assessment -R 2,500,00.



Questions and Discussion

- Financial sustainability for Umalusi whereby financial support for the organization would be available to cover most if not all of the functions prescribed by the Act.
- 2. Active governmental responsibility for all private institutions, like independent schools; private adult education centres; and private colleges.
- 3. A comprehensive strategy and program for adult education to make adult education a real and viable learning path for adults.
- Finalisation of the NQF review in order to advance the coherence, improvement and simplification of the education and training system.
