Key objectives of the programme

- Integration of HIV/AIDS life skills across learning areas
- Training and development: educator & EMGD
- Promotion of functional peer education programmes in all secondary schools
- Creation of systems of care and support for infected and affected learners
- Provision of age learner appropriate learner/teacher support material
- Research, monitoring and evaluation

MONITORING OF SPENDING IN THE 2005/06 FINANCIAL YEAR

- The following monitoring activities are currently in place and will continue for the duration of this programme:
- Monthly Expenditure Reports:
- From the Provincial Programme Manager/s, an Expenditure Control Report is submitted to the Chief Financial Officer who, in turn, will report at national level, in accordance with the Division of Revenue Act. This report reflects the budget allocated and actual expenditure.
- Monthly progress meetings:
- Monthly progress meetings were held with all the relevant stakeholders at District level to strengthen the established relationship and to monitor the implementation of the programme. The department also participated in the EC Interdepartmental HIV/AIDS forum (IDHAC) and progress reports are submitted on a monthly basis.
- At school level, school principals and Life Orientation educators, who are appointed as the HIV and AIDS Co-ordinators in their schools do fulfill specified monitoring functions, reporting to the District Co-ordinators.
- Monthly meetings of the HIV/AIDS Steering Committee also took place.

MONITORING OF SPENDING IN THE 2005/06 FINANCIAL YEAR (Continued)

- Monthly reports were submitted, which reflected activities completed against deliverables and time frames, success indicators and targets met, as well as challenges encountered. The reports also described factors such as provisioning (requisitions/tenders) against the actual delivery of goods and services. Finally, the reports also compare actual expenditure against cash flow projections.
- Three quarterly reports and an annual report have been submitted in compliance to the Division of Revenue Act.

School Nutrition Programme

- Monitoring of supplier performance in place ongoing challenge
- Introduction of hot meals planned more cost efficient
- Temporary MIS in place to administer programme more efficiently
