- o Talent identification (co-responsibility;
- Education and Training;
- Ensuring that integrated sports management information is available to all stakeholders;
- o Coordination of Government's involvement in the 2010 FIFA World Cup™ (2010 Unit);
- o Providing support, from a Government perspective, for the hosting of major events in South Africa;
- Interpreting broad government policy, translating government policy into policies for sport and recreation for South Africa, revising such
 policies if and when necessary, and monitoring the implementation of policy;
- o Co-ordinating and contributing to the drafting of all legislation for sport and recreation;
- Aligning sport and recreation policy with the policies of other government departments in the spirit of integrated planning and delivery;
- o Providing legal advice to all stakeholders in sport and recreation from a government perspective;
- Subsidising clients of SRSA in accordance with the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA), its concomitant regulations, as well as the SRSA funding policy, monitoring the application of such funds and advising clients on the management of their finances;
- Managing inter- and intra-governmental relations (i.e. relations between government departments in South Africa horizontally and vertically as well as with foreign governments co-operating with South Africa in sport and recreation), to ensure desirable outcomes in and through sport and recreation;
- o Coordinating the acknowledgement of the outstanding contributions of sportspersons to South African society;

- o Procuring resources from abroad for sport and recreation through the appropriate structures in National Treasury and the DTI;
