ETQA

- Training of 200 assessors in all provinces except Cape and Free State
- All DoL Provincial offices nominated assessors for training - co ordinated through DoL
- Assisted all provinces that were implementing the FASSET learnerships (IPFA) with work place accreditation
- Participated in the Eastern Cape with the development of policies for RPL, Learnerships and ABET training
- Monitored Western Cape Administration Academy
- Represent PSETA on the Advisory body of LOGOLA (Local Government Leadership Academy) within DPLG

- The PSETA has attended the Provincial Skills Development Forums in the North West, but could unfortunately not attend the one in the Eastern Cape due to short notice.
- Improvement on PSDF's – capacity building and understanding the skills development arena, plans to be actioned, task team orientation
