- Skills Development & Training UYF training programmes have a bias towards preparing young people to access jobs and support to start and manage their enterprises. UYF is phasing out technical skills programmes and scaling up, programmes that link youth to opportunities:
  - Graduate Development Programme & partnership related training;
  - Cooperatives Training;
  - Entrepreneurship Education;
  - Supplier Development Training;

- National Youth Service Programme The youth service programme affords young people the opportunity to acquire skills whilst they serve their communities.
- Job Opportunities Seekers Database ("Graduate Database") –
   Aimed at linking unemployed graduates to job opportunities.

- Youth Entrepreneurship Business Development Support BDS is aimed at providing non financial business support to young entrepreneurs and enterprises. The interventions are as follows:
  - Business Consulting Service (Business Development Support Voucher Programme);
  - Business Opportunity Support Service
  - Volunteer Mentorship

- Youth Entrepreneurship Enterprise Finance Provides access to finance by lending and investing in youth owned enterprises. The following finance options are available:
  - Micro loans up to R50 000
  - Small loans –R50 001 up to R500 000
  - Medium loans R500 001 to R5million

- Information and Counselling UYF provides young people with information on
  - career development
  - employment
  - entrepreneurship
  - citizenship
  - health & wellbeing

# **Impact targets (2008-2010)**

- Over the next three years, Umsobomvu Youth Fund will achieve the following impact:
  - 20.6 million interactions represented by Internet Portal hits, calls to the Call Centre, visits to Youth Advisory Centres and the number of youth card holders. The interactions will enable young persons to access information on careers, jobs and entrepreneurship;

- 212,500 young people to acquire skills training with an estimated 75% (159,375) expected to access sustainable livelihoods (jobs, selfemployment) upon graduation;
- 84,000 young people to serve in category 1 National Youth Service projects implemented by NGO's/CBO's, category 2 projects FET and HET Student Volunteers and category 3 projects for Volunteerism. An additional 90,000 unemployed young people in category 1 NYS projects implemented by government departments;

 212,500 young people to acquire skills training with an estimated 75% (159,375) expected to access sustainable livelihoods (jobs, selfemployment) upon graduation;

- 525,000 unemployed graduates registered on the Graduates
   Database to secure 26,250 job opportunities;
- 1,290 women and youth-owned Small and Medium Enterprises and 43,871 micro-financed businesses accessing R533 million of funding from UYF and facilitating an additional R390m from private sector banks and development funding institutions.
   72,378 jobs are to be created from the loans and investments;

- R206.2 million of business and procurement opportunities accessed by 39,022 young entrepreneurs, and creating 58,527 sustainable jobs; and
  - 60 youth owned business established in incubators.
  - Therefore, the total number of jobs that are envisaged to be created is about 360,795 and 71 222 businesses will be supported.
