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

FINAL MANDATE FOR FOODSTUFFS, COSMETICS AND DISINFECTANT AMENDMENT BILL [B35B-2005]

(Section 76 Bills)

1. INTRODUCTION

The Chairperson of the Portfolio Committee on Health, Hon IWJ Stadhouer tabled the Committee's recommendations in respect of the final mandate as adopted by the Portfolio Committee on the 13 October 2006, on the *Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Amendment Bill* [B35B-2005].

2. PROCESS FOLLOWED

2.1 The Speaker of the NCPL has on receipt of the Bill referred the *Foodstuffs, Cosmetic and Disinfectants Amendment Bill* [B35B-2005] to the Portfolio Committee on Health on the 29th August 2006.

2.2 The Portfolio Committee received a briefing on the Bill from the Northern Cape's Permanent Delegate to the NCOP Hon MA Sulliman at its meeting on the 7th of September 2006.

The Portfolio Committee also invited the Department of Health to brief and present to the Committee the views and position of the Provincial Executive Council on the Bill.

2.3 The Portfolio Committee resolved at its meeting held on 7 September 2006 to hold public hearings on the referred Bill in the districts of Port Nolloth, Kakamas, Colesberg, Warrenton, Kuruman and De Aar to solicit the views of the affected beneficial communities and stakeholders including SALGA with regard to the *Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Amendment Bill*.

2.4 Six (6) public hearings were facilitated as per Committee resolution and both written and oral submissions were called for and the public extensively engaged with the Committee on their views.

- 2.5 On 13 October 2006 the Portfolio Committee deliberated and considered the submissions and concerns of the *Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Amendment Bill* [B35B-2005].


3. KEY DETERMINING PRINCIPLES

- The public hearings held by the Portfolio Committee were successful.
- An overwhelming majority of the public that attended the hearing supported the proposed amendment Bill.

4. FINAL VOTING MANDATE

In terms of Section 65 of the Constitution, the Portfolio Committee on Health recommended that the House confer authority on the Head of its Delegation to the NCOP to vote in support of the *Foodstuffs, Cosmetics, and Disinfectants Amendments Bill* [B35B-2005]

The House having considered the recommendations of the Portfolio Committee on Health now confers on the Province's Permanent Delegates the authority to vote for the Bill.


3. CONSIDERATION

PUBLIC INPUTS

- a. Government should hire more health inspectors to monitor any goods or products that are selling by shops, hawkers and butcheries.
- b. Health inspectors must have office that operates 24hrs or toll free number where people can report their problems.
- c. Director General must give powers to the Local government or health inspectors.
- d. All traditional food and alcohol must be tested and registered.
- e. Each village must have mini abattoir where health inspectors will assist to check meat.
- f. All the products that are produced by manufacturers must show expiry date and warning must be written in red letters.
- g. All the import products must be tested before it enter in the country.
- h. All the cosmetics must have label and show the age restriction and how dangerous it is.
- i. The cosmetics advertisements should also show how dangerous is the cosmetics.
- j. All the disinfectants products must have labels.
- k. There should be a dumping site to throw all the expired food, cosmetics and disinfectants products.
- l. Warnings on the cosmetics and disinfectants must be written in different languages.
- m. All disinfectants with strong smell must be abolished.
- n. R 25.00 should be increased to R 100.00.
- o. Other universities, Department of trade industries and SAB should be consulted.
