Tourism growth and development: Achievements

- International arrivals grew by 10.3% to 7,368,742
- · 2010 Tourism Development Plan completed
- · 2 Tourism Satellite accounts completed
- · 13 guides trained in Chinese
- · 161 guides trained in French
- 495 transactions worth R630m facilitated through TEP (312 HDE benefited)
- · 3000 tourism establishments were graded countrywide
- 74 assessors of tourism product and services trained.
- New visitor facilities completed at Walter Sisulu, Lowveld, Free State and Pretoria NBGs
- · Kirstenbosch, 750 000 visitors

2. Tourism grew annually by 6,5% for 12 years on average

Tourism grew rapidly between 1994 and 1998 at a rate of 11.8%. We consolidated our performance between 1998 and 2001 and then grew by 6.2% from 2001 to 2005.
