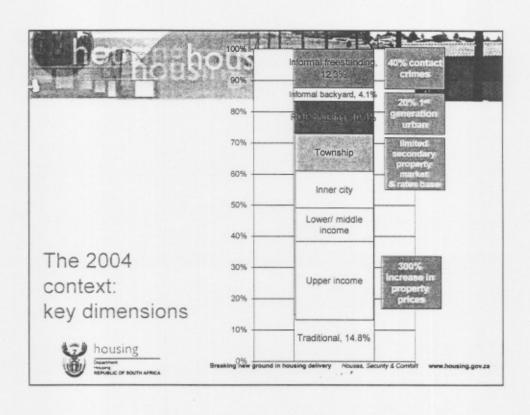

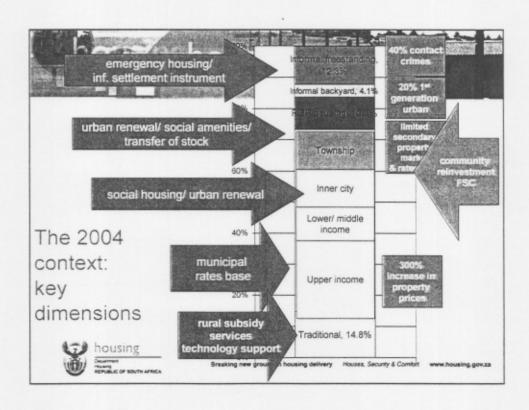

The urban context; Further Challe

- The backlog in 2005 was estimated at nearly 2,4million households and is growing despite the delivery achieved
 - Statistics show that the average size of an household is shrinking whilst absolute numbers of households have increased
 - There has been growth in the number of informal settlements
- Migration trends have meant that the areas of high economic activities like the major cities have been put under severe pressure particularly in providing basic social services (and shelter)
 - Creates further challenges on the choice of housing solutions available to the poor and migrations that may have accessed housing before
 - Creates a variety of Social dysfunctionalties in our urban centers
 Creates the conditions for people who leave in extremely harsh
 Conditions hence the development of the Emergency Housing

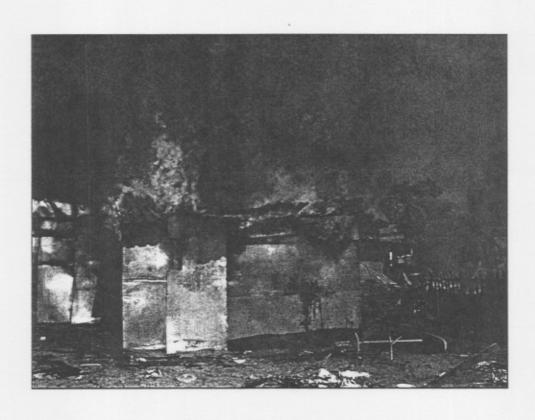

- Administrative blockages in housing delivery
 - Delays in Township establishment
 - Lengthy land legal and infrastructure provision process
