



FET: CONTEXT

- The grant covers 2 areas, i.e. Urban College and Rural College.
- The grant provides for the following:
 - √ staff development and training opportunities;
 - √ to develop systems and procedures for new programmes;
 - √ to purchase equipment to support teaching and learning;
 - ✓ to build new classrooms, and upgrade, refurbish and modernise classrooms and workshops



FET: PROGRESS REPORT

- Urban College:
- 32 staff members trained.
- Central office linked electronically with campuses.
- Equipment purchased for 3 labs and 31 computers upgraded and audio-visual equipment installed.
- 8 classrooms tiled and 70% of work done on renovations of 3 labs and IT workshop.
- 90% of Kimberley campus site rehabilitated.



FET: PROGRESS REPORT (cont.)

- Rural College:
- 46 staff members trained.
- 22 staff members trained on new electronic system - Coltech.
- 62 computers bought for Upington, 40 for Kuruman and Engineering tools for Namaqua site.
- Rehabilitation of campus site planned for 2007.



PSNP: CONTEXT

- The grant limits expenditure to Primary School learners only.
- The province feeds Secondary School learners from its voted funds.
- Food handlers are provided with work opportunities through the EPWP programme – they should eventually be able to embark on related careers or become food-entrepreneurs



PSNP: CONTEXT (cont.)

- It is important that expenditure is sufficient to ensure that learners are not denied access to the nutrition programme over the winter season.
- The dip in projected expenditure in January 2007 reflects the lower supply of the nutrition programme over the school holidays.
- It is important that the planning is close to the mark to prevent a rush for supplies at year-end.



PSNP Progress Report

- ➤ No of learners fed = 127 181 in Grade R-7
- ➤ No of schools= 319, quintile 1-5
- No of feeding days=174 days per annum (additional funding for 18 days from Treasury)
- ➤ No of feeding days for Jul. Sept. 2006 = 49 days
- > Rate per learner per day for food= R1.00
- > Rate per learner per day for admin= R0,15
- Rate per learner per day for admin in farm and schools with enrolment -200 learners=R0,25
- > 313 SMME's enlisted as service providers
