  - 84% of the adjusted budget
  - 3% decline when compared to 87% 2005/06.

### **National School Nutrition Programme**

- Adjusted Budget: R31, 9 million
- Total transfers received : R29,6 million
- Total spent as at 31st March 2007 R29, 2 million
- 92% of the Adjusted Budget.
  - A slight decrease compared to 93% 2005/06

Reasons for below average spending as indicated by the department:

### HIV & AIDS

- The slow spending, according to the department is attributed to the review of the business plan in April 2006. As a result the spending in the first three months were not incurred.
- National School Nutrition Programme

Garden equipment for 44 schools had been procured during the last month of the financial year, the service provider had supplied the goods. The department however failed to process the payment on time.

    - Adjusted Budget R72, 7 million

    - Expenditure as at 31st March 2007 R66, 3 million
      - 91% of the Adjusted Budget spent.
      - A decline when to compared to 110% in 2005/06.

- Reasons for slow spending
  - Comprehensive HIV & AIDS
    - Although the grant shows underspending, records shows that it is fully spent as at financial year end.
    - Expenditure was wrongfully allocated against the Equitable Share. Corrections have since been effected.

- Forensic Pathology Services Grant
  - Slower spending, according to the department, is attributed to:
    - Delays in the granting of permission by NDPW to upgrade the SAPS mortuaries. Permission was only granted on the 27<sup>th</sup> January 2007.
    - Delays in delivery of mortuary vehicles worth R3m.
    - Delay in staff training, procurement of uniforms and the installation the IT Equipment and Systems.

# Hospital Revitilisation

- Slow spending, according to the department is attributed to:
  - Slow progress at the Mental Health Hospital Project in Kimberley, and
  - The suspension of the two projects in Upington and De Aar on the request of National Health.
